Introduction and context

- Sharing information effectively across health and care settings is vital in protecting vulnerable children and young people and preventing further harm
- Over 66,000 plans (CPP, LAC & UCPP) already uploaded from social care systems across England
- Utilising SCRa provides health professionals with instant access
- Unscheduled care settings may be working with no prior knowledge of the child and may be only one of numerous such settings that the child has attended

Introduction and context 2

- This is a secure system with clear rules governing access
 only authorised staff involved with the care of a child can access the information
- Using SCRa health professionals can see if a child they are treating is subject to a plan and given the name of the responsible local authority and contact details
- Onus is on health professionals to initiate a clinician to clinician conversation
- Social care teams are automatically notified when a child in their care attends an unscheduled care setting

CP-IS: A national system

A national system that connects local authorities' child social care IT systems with those used by unscheduled healthcare settings (e.g. ED) in England, to provide better care and earlier intervention for children who are considered vulnerable and at risk



Unscheduled care settings: Emergency departments, walk-in centres, minor injury units, GP out of hours, maternity services, paediatric wards and ambulance services






Smartcard authentication


Whenever you use the SCRa, you are required to use your smartcard.

Insert your smartcard and enter your passcode and select your role.




NHS Spine Portal menu




Find patient – PDS search



Find patient – advanced PDS search




Child Care Alert tab

If there are multiple plans present these will be presented in list form.




Child Care Alert tab

Child Care Alert tab



Options for CP-IS access via SCRa

1. ADMINISTRATOR checks for CP-IS

- sees child care alert and clicks on tab
- prints information for clinicians


2. ADMINISTRATOR checks for CP-IS

- sees child care alert but do not click tab
- sets safeguarding alert on local patient record system
- clinician sees alert and will access CP-IS directly on spine


3. CLINICIAN checks for CP-IS information directly

triage nurse, ED doctors, safeguarding team




Permission to view screen

Additional Information SCR






NB: Express patient consent is required at the patient's registered GP practice for the additional information to flow onto the SCR.
